What is the Difference Between Palliative Care and Hospice?

Good Shepherd Palliative Care	BOTH Palliative Care and Hospice	Good Shepherd Community Hospice

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Good Shepherd Palliative Care

Consider a referral for a Palliative Care Consult if your patient has any of the following:

One or more serious illnesses
A change in condition or overall declining health
Rapid disease progression
Functional decline
Frequent hospitalizations/readmissions
Symptom management needs
Limited psychosocial support
A new diagnosis
A need for goals of care or advanced care planning discussions
